Dear Friends,

Two years ago we were making final preparations for our Sabbatical. As always seems to be the case with such things - to me it seems like yesterday. And yet, a lot has happened in those two years!

Nearly a year ago, we began our "Good Neighbor Team" relationship with a refugee family from Afghanistan, a Mom and Dad and five children, who members of the GNT have come to love and enjoy time with - and others from the congregation have enjoyed time with them as well. It's amazing how many of the things we take for granted (the way school and health care systems work, where and how we acquire food, even transportation) are puzzling if one is from a different culture. Several members of the team (mainly Mariellen Boomhower, Jeannette Storch, Rina Bell, and Liz Dobson-Davis) have spent countless hours accompanying, explaining, advocating, investigating, and assisting our friends with these various systems. As is often said - God always calls together just the right group of people for the task at hand – and that is certainly true in this case. Meanwhile, as is also often the case – we feel we've gained as much as we've given in interacting with this lovely, gracious, hardworking family, who have been through so much more than we can imagine - being with them gives us hope.

Also over these two years, the vision for fixing and improving our building has evolved into a plan. Now, we are ready to begin serious work on that plan. On Sunday, April 28, the Building Committee will host a "forum" right after Worship, where you can ask any questions you have about the plans, and we will also launch the campaign through which we hope to fund that which we cannot cover with grants and capital funds already on hand. The amount we'll be seeking in pledges from the congregation and friends is \$200,000. Daunting - but we believe it is possible for "the little church that can." This committee, made up of Alex James (Property Chair), Rina Bell, Mariellen Boomhower, Rick Longhurst, Nancy Taylor, and Tim and Kathy, is yet another example of God calling together the right group for the task. We've talked, strategized, and visioned, sought quotes and input, and come to consensus on a plan that we truly believe will help us to continue to live our mission of "Doing Justice, Loving Kindness, and Walking Humbly" for many years into the future. Come to that meeting, read the plans, and please, prayerfully consider a gift.

But first, come to the Craft Fair on Saturday, April 27! Wendi and Olivia Brandow, and others, have once again worked hard to put together a day of fun and crafts, with all proceeds going, as always, to Trinity's Mission work. Join us, do a little shopping, volunteer if you can! And enjoy some fellowship with others.

Building Renovation Update


After Worship on Sunday, April 28, we will hold a Building Renovation Q & A on both our progress and the funding campaign. Building Renovation pledge packets will be handed out on April 28, and if they are not picked up, they will be mailed out. These packets will contain the relevant information thus far. If you do not receive an envelope and would like one, please contact the Church Office, and we can get one to you promptly.

We are seeking to raise \$200,000 over a three year period to pay for the congregational portion of the \$429,400 estimated cost. The rest of the costs will be covered by grants, fundraising, our own in-house funds, and income from ultimately the cell phone tower.

The first phase of the renovation, which consists of repairing the front wall of the basement, installing (and relocating) a new septic, and replacing the flooring in the Sanctuary and Basement, will take place this Summer. We already have the funds to do these projects.

Before we cover the old tile with the luxury vinyl tile flooring, we will invite everyone to sign the old floor as a way of remembering our presence here! Also, we will need many hands to help move chairs and other equipment to clear the spaces for the tile to be installed. This is one way we are keeping the cost down! Details on when this will be needed is TBA.

In the meantime, prayerfully consider making your pledge to the Renovation Project. We recognize it is a "big ask," but one that is sorely needed. The project will not only fix what needs repairing and modernize worn facilities, but ready us to do ministry more effectively now and into the future.

Atlas of the Heart—Final Discussion Wednesday, May 29, 7 PM


